We offer an introductory course covering

- ◆ the basic properties of the materials
- ◆ the various construction methods
- ◆ texturing and polishing techniques
- ◆ the range of tools available
- ◆ the forms of metal available and assay requirements



The course is an overview of the methods and techniques of the silversmith and is a useful, though not essential, way of getting started quickly on your first project.
